**RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING the 100th ANNIVERSARY
of the HIGH BRIDGE PUBLIC LIBRARY**

WHEREAS, High Bridge's first library was the idea of Lucy Taylor, wife of Knox Taylor owner of the Taylor Wharton Foundry

WHEREAS, the first library was built on the edge of the Taylor Wharton Foundry pond and opened on September 15, 1914 at 3pm.

WHEREAS, in 1938, the library relocated to Main Street on the second floor of Borough Hall

WHEREAS, on May 8, 1965, the library moved to its present location in the small white building adjacent to Borough Hall

WHEREAS, over the past 100 years, the library has had nine librarians: Mary Flowers, James Anderson, Dorothy DeYoung, Mary Cardenas, Lucille Weigel, Mary Alice Harvey, Sue Lathrop, Judy Gary, and presently Terry Steets

WHEREAS, the High Bridge Library is now part of the Hunterdon County Library System

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of High Bridge in the County of Hunterdon and in the State of New Jersey hereby recognizes the High Bridge Public Library for 100 years of service.
