WHEREAS, on January 1, 2007, the “New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play” Law, *N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5 et. seq.*, became effective; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of High Bridge has a need to award certain professional contracts for services required by the municipality in calendar year 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Pay-to-Play Law permits such services to be acquired through two processes, including the “non-fair and open” process as defined in *N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.7* on those contracts where it is anticipated that the total cost will exceed \$17,500.00; and

WHEREAS, the public good and interest of the citizens of the Borough of High Bridge will best be served by the “non-fair and open” process to secure experienced professional services, rather than the “fair and open” process of awarding a contract to the lowest bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Borough C.F.O. has determined and certified in writing that the value of each of these professional services may, in the aggregate, exceed \$17,500.00; and

WHEREAS, each professional will be required to first complete and submit a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which will certify that the said professional consultant and their firm have not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the previous one year, and that their contract will prohibit the said professional consultant and their firm from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of High Bridge, County of Hunterdon and in the State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The following 2016 professional contracts shall be awarded under the “non-fair and open” process:

The Borough does not anticipate that executive session minutes covered by the following sections of the Open Public Meetings Act will be released: N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b(1)(information rendered confidential by State or Federal statute), b(3)(material constituting an unwarranted invasion of privacy), b(7)(advice falling within the attorney-client privilege), b(8)(certain employment matters, unless the affected employees or appointees request the release in writing) and b(9)(deliberations regarding the imposition of specific civil penalties)."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of High Bridge, in the County of Hunterdon and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The general public shall be excluded from the discussions in these matters pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 10:4-12B.
2. Matters discussed in Executive Session shall, when appropriate, be made public.
3. It is anticipated that formal action may be taken following this Executive Session.

WHEREAS, the amount of \$7,000.00 has been determined as the amount needed to pay for the costs for work to be performed by General Code in the revision and codification of ordinances;

WHEREAS, the special emergency appropriation shall be provided for in succeeding annual budgets by the inclusion of at least 1/5 of the amount authorized pursuant to this act (N.J.S. 40A:4-55)

- SECTION 2. A certified copy of the Ordinance, as finally adopted, shall be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.
- SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption at the second reading, approval and publication in accordance with the law.

Many issuers are subject to more than one CDA and they often have different requirements. Older ones are typically the most burdensome. Our compliance methodology meets those requirements.

2) PROVIDE REMINDERS TO YOU OF UPCOMING DEADLINES

Typically a dissemination agent waits for you, the issuer, to provide items to be filed. This puts the entire burden on you. They only file for the specific issues on which they are appointed – and then only after you provide the information to them. Phoenix Advisors takes a more helpful proactive approach to our client service. We regularly remind our clients' weeks in advance of filing deadlines and also follow up on those reminders. We understand that clients have a lot on their plate and a variety of deadlines is difficult to monitor. We do it for you.

3) COMPILATION OF STATISTICAL DATA TO MEET YOUR OBLIGATION

In addition to the filing of your Audited Financial information CDA's also require filing of what Regulators call an "Annual Report". 5) COORDINATE AND SUBMIT OPTIONAL "VOLUNTARY" SUBMISSIONS

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into on this ____ day of _____, 2016 (“Agreement”) by and between the Borough of High Bridge, (hereinafter referred to as the “Bond Issuer”), 71 Main Street, High Bridge, NJ 08829 and Phoenix Advisors, LLC., 4 West Park Street, Bordentown, NJ 08505 (“Phoenix Advisors”),.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Bond Issuer has heretofore agreed through the execution of Continuing Disclosure Agreements (“CDA’s”) in connection with one or more bond issuances to provide certain financial and other information and notices, within specified timeframes, in a manner prescribed by the regulators of the underwriter that purchased said bond issues; and

WHEREAS, but for the execution of the CDA’s, the underwriter of such bonds would be prohibited from purchasing the bonds of the Bond Issuer; and

WHEREAS, in order to ascertain its compliance with various CDA’s executed in conjunction with the issuance of bonds, the Bond Issuer must codify the requirements stipulated in those various CDA’s and compare those requirements with its filings and correct any deficiencies; and

Section 5. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey.






Dear Bonnie:

To High Bridge Town Hall and Council,

My name is Peter E. Benson. My wife's name is Dorise C. Benson. We own the property at 32 Silverthorne Rd. in High Bridge. (lot 1 block 15). It is an 1811 fieldstone and wood colonial and currently on the market. Prior to listing the property, we hired a company to do a diagnostic evaluation of the septic system, including the leach field. The technician informed us that the leach field failed inspection and was basically non-existent after 20 years of use. We have a narrow property and it's at the bottom of the hill. So we get all the water from the top of the hill in our yard everytime it rains, maxing out our leach field. He also said that in order to sell the house, we would need a new leach field and septic system, which would most likely have to be a turkey mound type. Not only is the cost prohibitive (35k to 55k) but it is also an eye sore that frankly no one wants in their backyard. This in turn will make selling the property much more difficult. Of course if that's the only option we have, then that's what we have to do.

I know it's not your problem, it's our problem, but we were hoping you might consider allowing us to hook up to city sewer. The right hand corner of the property is approximately 75 to 80 ft to the crest of the hill where city sewer is available. This would be a huge upgrade for the property and for the town as well. Making it easier to sell the house and for anyone in the future to purchase it. This is one of the oldest houses in the borough and it would bring a 19th century house (1811) into the 21st century. Really a septic system is nothing more than a time bomb that has to be addressed somewhere down the road.

We are currently going through a divorce. The divorce is contingent upon the sale of the house. I was forced out 13 months ago and now reside at my parents' house in Morris Plains while paying 95% of the house infrastructure bills. It would help me enormously if I could get out from under the weight of my monthly financial obligations (\$3000.00), sooner rather than later. My relationship with my wife has become very difficult, hostile, uncivil and sadly clear that we need to get away from each other and move on. Please consider allowing us to hook up to city sewer, as this may be the difference between being able to sell the house easily or not. Thank you for your time and attention to this matter. We respectfully await your decision.
